For the first time, Geneva will host the European Conference on Computational Biology (ECCB 2026), supported by the Swiss Confederation and organized by the [SIB Swiss Institute of Bioinformatics](#), Switzerland's leading organization for biological and biomedical data science, ECCB 2026 will position Geneva at the forefront of the data-driven transformation of life sciences.

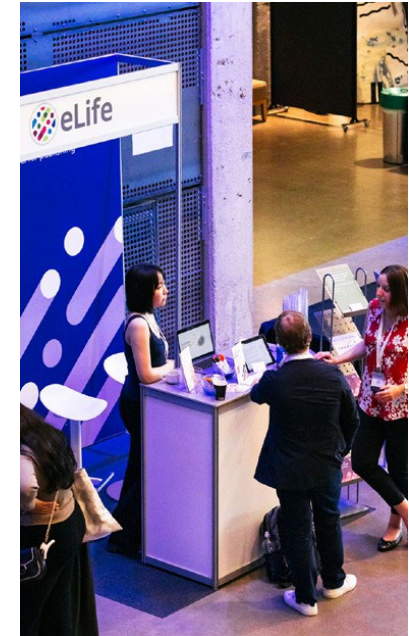

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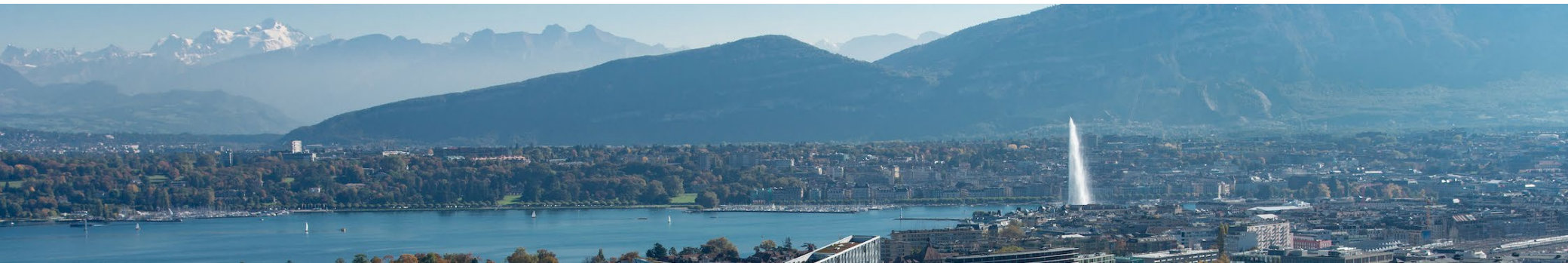

1. Setting the scene...

A prestigious opening ceremony to highlight ECCB's political importance

The opening ceremony of ECCB 2026 will position Geneva as a global hub for dialogue on data, artificial intelligence, and the future of life sciences.

The ceremony will bring together leading representatives from Swiss federal and cantonal authorities, **including the President of the Swiss Confederation, Guy Parmelin, and the President of the Canton of Geneva, Anne Hiltbold**, alongside academic leaders and representatives of the scientific community.

Their remarks will highlight Switzerland's commitment to data-driven research and responsible innovation in artificial intelligence, reflecting the growing strategic importance of data-driven science for innovation, health, the environment, and international cooperation.



2. “If data could breathe”

An artistic performance highlighting Geneva’s creative scene at the intersection of art and data science

During the opening ceremony, an original dance creation entitled “if data could breathe” by choreographer **Lucy Nightingale** will set the tone for the conference by illustrating the power of data science to serve society.

Two classical dancers and a hip-hop dancer will perform in front of the full-height screen of the CICG plenary hall, animated by generative visuals created by digital artist **Mideric Cassone**.

Through movement, light and digital imagery, the performance will evoke the themes of the conference and the connections it seeks to foster between science, innovation, and society.



3. Public outreach event (*session publique*)

An afternoon dedicated the societal challenges of data – 31 August

On the opening day, ECCB will host a special afternoon (in French) dedicated to a non-specialist audience, highlighting how data-driven science contributes to addressing major societal challenges. Key representatives from the Canton of Geneva, as well as journalists and invited guests, will attend the event.

Scientific perspectives

- **Internationally recognized scientists will present the opportunities and limitations of data science in fields such as personalized medicine, epidemic preparedness, biodiversity protection, and responsible data use.**
- **These talks will illustrate how computational biology contributes to solutions for some of today's most pressing global challenges.**

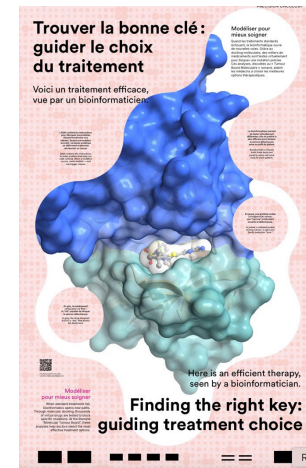
4. Datarium – Geneva at the heart of life science data

Bringing the power of life-science data directly to the public through a large-scale open-air exhibition in the heart of Geneva and online

Installed during the month of August in iconic public spaces in the **heart of Geneva** (Parc des Bastions and Rotonde du Mont-Blanc), the exhibition will showcase how biological and biomedical data are transforming our understanding of health, epidemics, biodiversity and enables AI.

Through **30 visually engaging panels**, storytelling and interactive digital content, Datarium will make complex scientific ideas accessible and invite citizens to explore how data drive innovation and decision-making for the common good.

Pictures of the scientists featured in the exhibition will be taken by famous photographer **Nicolas Righetti**.

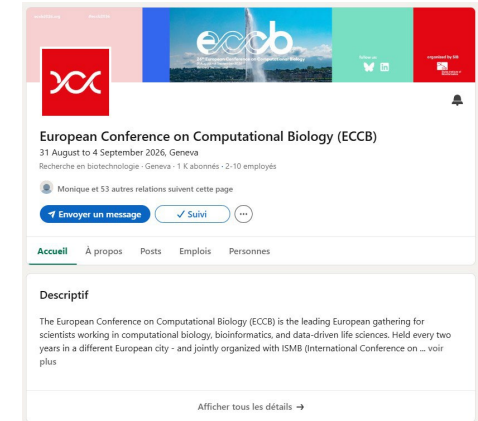
